

# Annual Listing of Federally Obligated Projects for Fiscal Year 2008

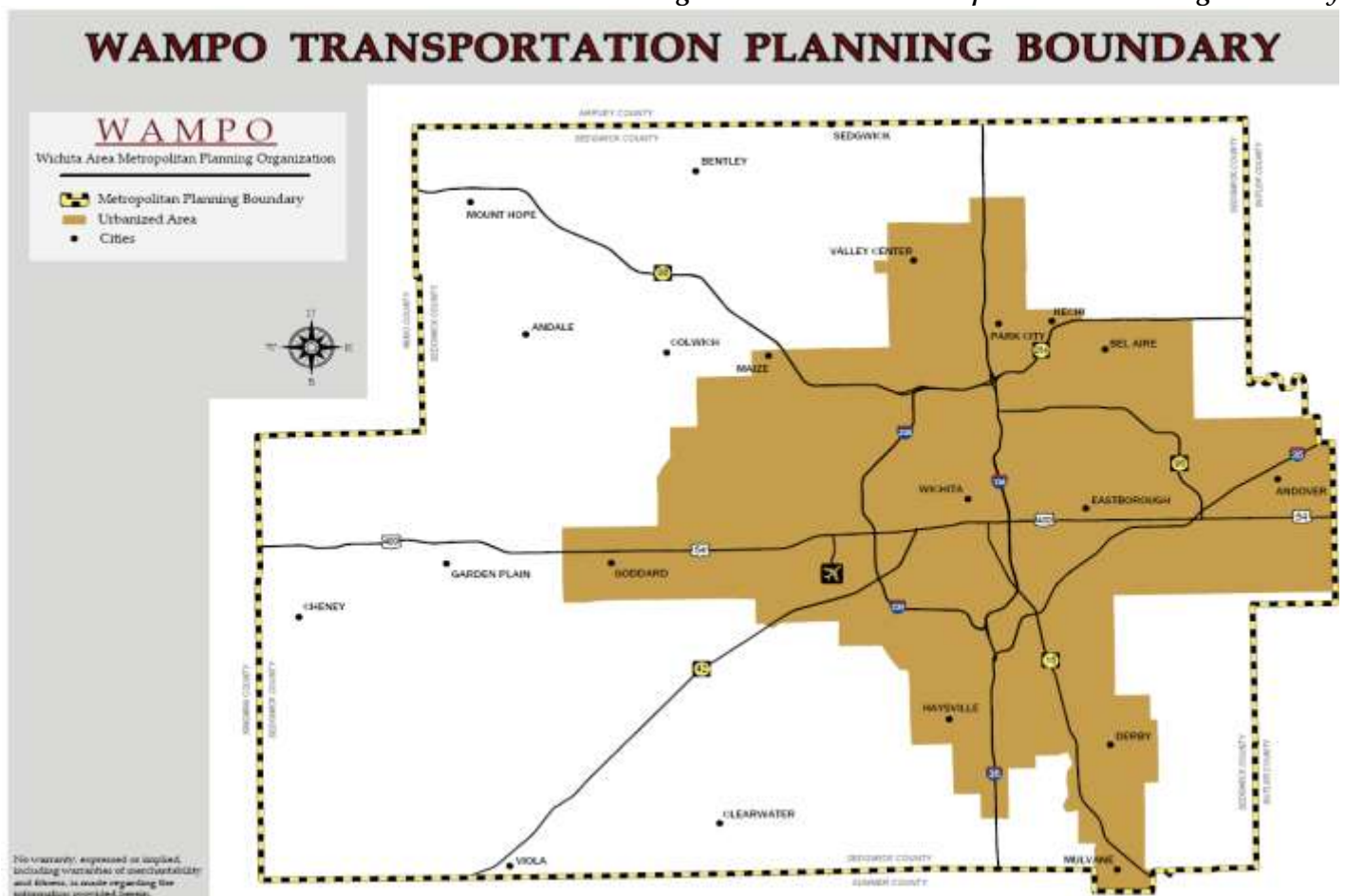
## Introduction

This document is used to increase transparency of federal transportation investments in the Wichita Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (WAMPO) region (*figure 1*).

The Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act; A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) directs Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPO) to produce an Annual List of Federally Obligated Projects showing all federal transportation funds obligated each federal fiscal year (FFY). The report information was provided by the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) and Wichita Transit (WT) and compiled by WAMPO staff.

This document accounts for federal transportation investments in the region made between October 1, 2007 and September 30, 2008 (FFY 2208) shown in the 2008 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The type of transportation investment can vary (bicycle/pedestrian, road and bridge projects, transit projects, etc.) but each project should be consistent with the goals and objectives of the WAMPO Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP). The LRTP addresses a 25 year horizon and looks out through the year 2030.

## Transportation Improvement Program

The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) identifies transportation projects (with cost estimates) to be implemented during the next four years. All projects in the region that will use federal transportation funds and/or are regionally significant are included in the TIP.

Regionally significant projects are those that support regional mobility and economic vitality.

Under federal regulations, the TIP:

- Covers a period of no less than four years;
- Is updated at least every four years;
- Considers all modes of transportation;
- Is approved by the Governor of Kansas, or designee;
- Summarizes anticipated funding amounts with realistic cost estimates;
- Is consistent with the LRTP; and
- Lists all federally funded and regionally significant projects, regardless of funding source.

According to WAMPO policy, a new TIP is developed every two years. This ensures accuracy of total project costs and allows changes in regional priorities as needed. ## Obligation Report

The following definitions correspond with the column headings of the tables on the following pages.

**Project Sponsor:** The organization responsible for the project. A project sponsor is responsible for timely completion of the project and provides any required matching funds.

**Grantee:** The recipient of federal funds for transit projects.

**Project Number:** The identification number used by KDOT for project management.

**Project Location/Name:** Used to identify project specifics.

**Work Type:** Describes the nature of work to be performed

**Funding Category:** Identifies the specific federal funding sources.

**FHWA Approval Date:** Date when funds first became available to project sponsors.

**Total Obligation Amount:** Amount of federal funding the project has received to date.
